

Writing a Book Review for Destiny

Why are we doing this? This is an authentic writing opportunity for getting other students excited about the books we have in the Riverdale Library!

I would like you to think of the following framework when writing your Destiny book review:

1. Your first sentence should “hook” the reader! It can be with a question relevant to the main events in the story or grab their attention in another interesting way.
2. The second (and maybe third) sentence(s) should summarize the book. You don’t need to go into too much detail, as Destiny already has a pretty complete synopsis for the library users.
3. The next sentence should share your opinion of the book and tell why you feel that way.
4. The last sentence should tell who you recommend should read the book.

Let’s look at a sample!

Have you ever felt the nervousness of being lost? Dish and Spoon, as well as their friends in many other nursery rhymes, don’t like being separated...not one little bit! In fact, the “Hey Diddle Diddle” rhyme can’t be read without them. This book will delight its readers with the many clever connections, fun mapping skills, and engaging rhythm of certain pages. It is recommended for first through fifth graders.

Suggestions:

- Write your review in a Word document and save it. You can copy and paste into Destiny. That way if a mistake happens, you don't have to rewrite it.
- Remember that I have to "approve" your review before it can be seen by all in the school. Make sure there are no errors, please. We want to think of our audience and respect them by having correct spelling that will help them read our reviews!
